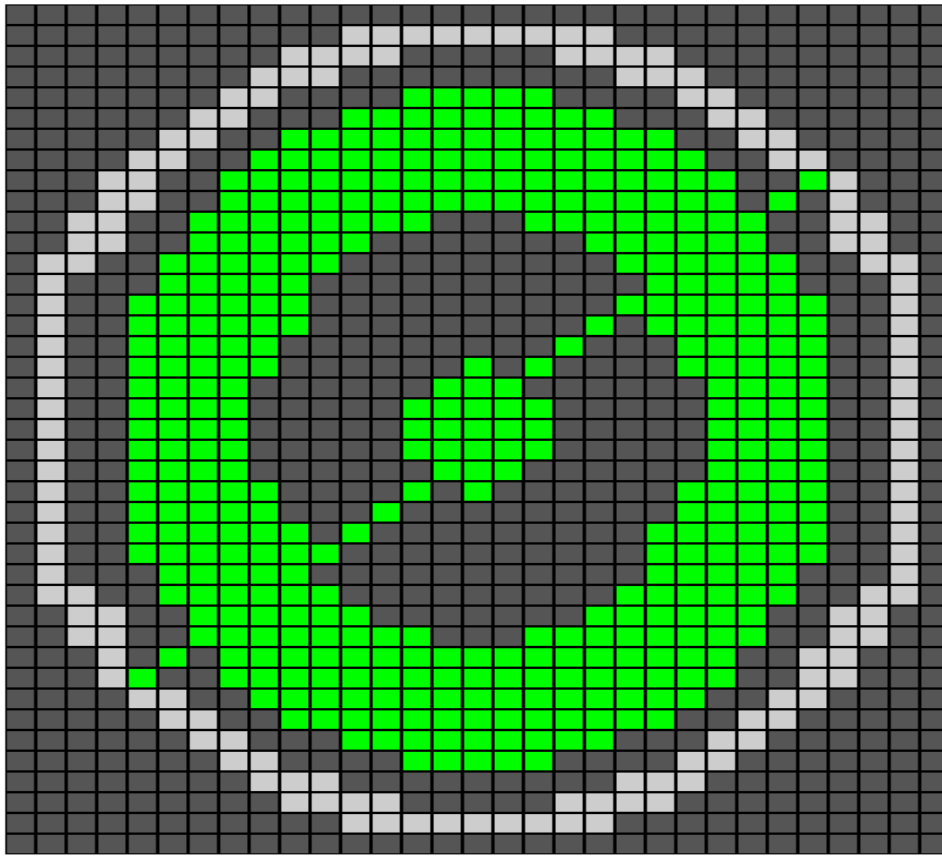


Knitted Galaxy Zoo Logo

Makes a knitted square 37 stitches by 47 rows with a garter stitch border.



Cast on 37 stitches in black

R1-3: 3 rows garter stitch (knit across all rows)

R4 (and all even rows until R44): knit across. Follow colour pattern.

R5 (and all odd rows until R43): K3, P31, K3. Follow colour pattern.

R45-47: 3 rows garter stitch

Cast off, weave in ends behind to finish.

Advice:

There are lots of techniques for switching colours and dealing with the extra strands.

For this method you will need 4 balls black, 3 balls green and 2 balls light grey:

- for colour patches of 3 or less stitches (e.g. the light grey) continue the black along.

- for colour patches of more than 3 stitches start new ball

- twine the strands when switching colour.

Slip the first stitch each row for neater edges.

Block out (dampen and stretch) after finished into a neater square.

(Abbreviations: R – row; K – knit; P – purl)
